India

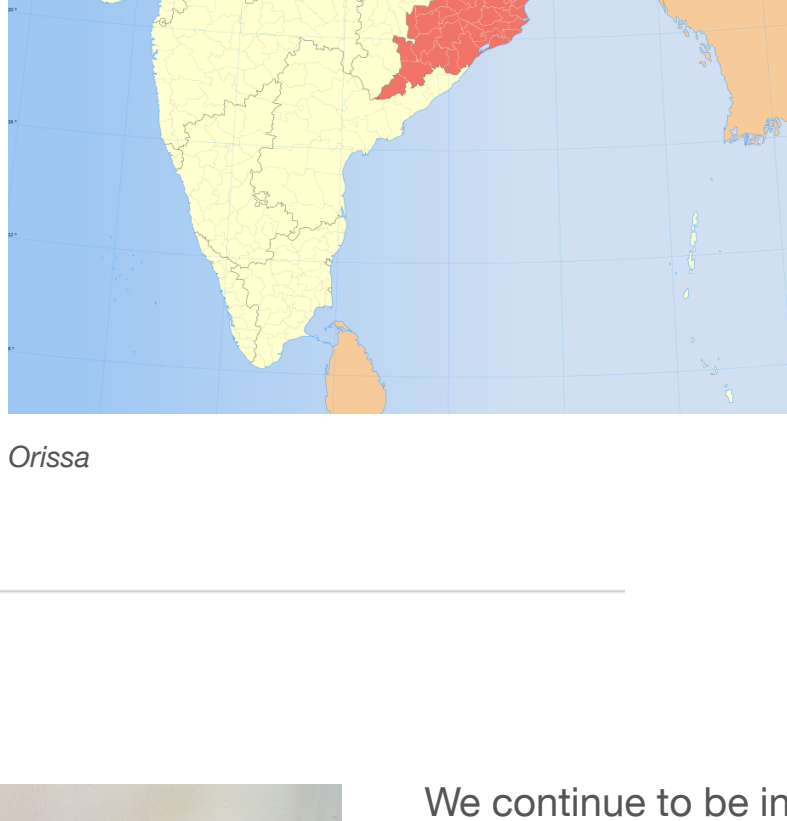


Punjab

Responding to God's Leading

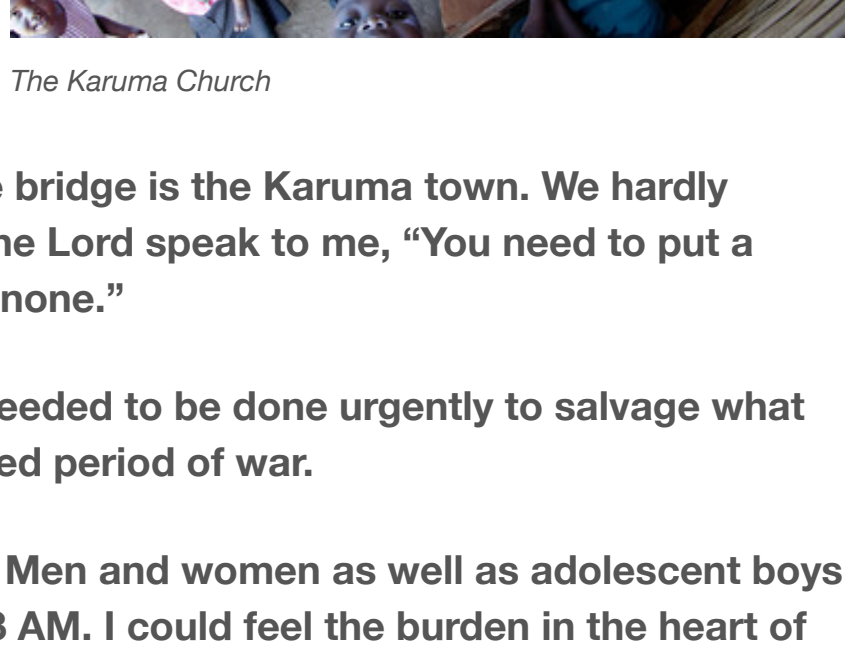
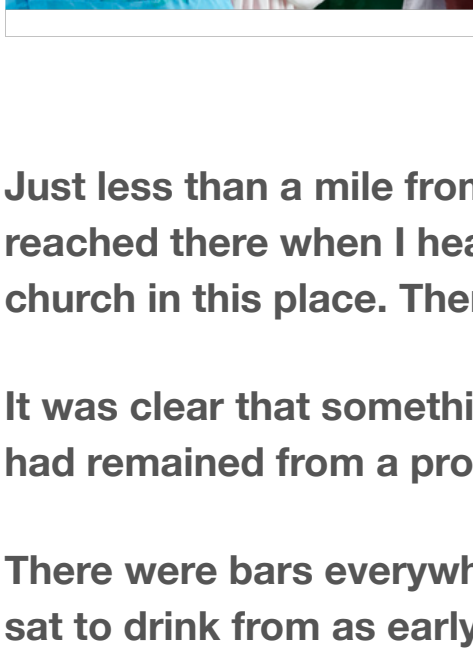
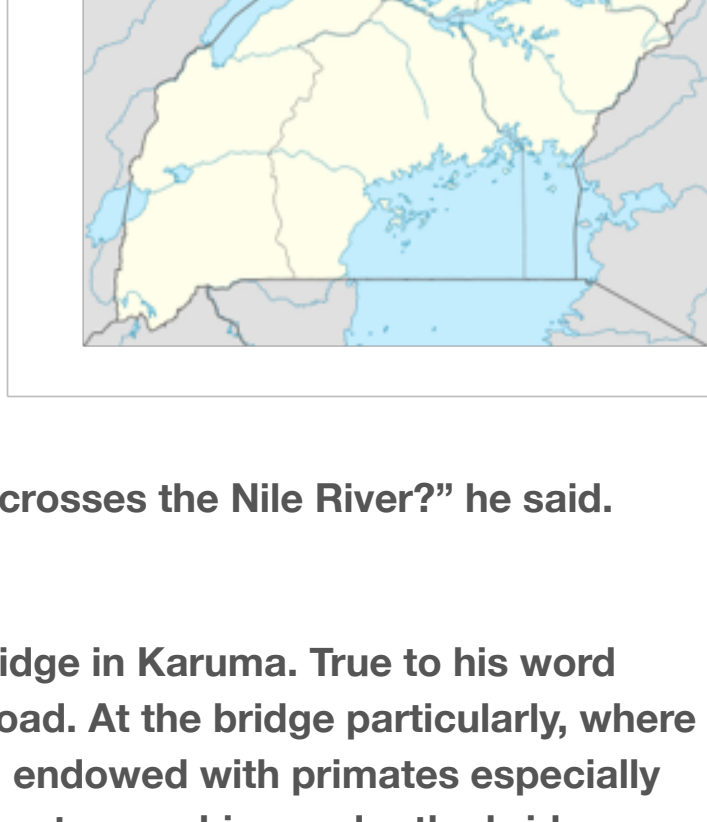
Our associate in Uganda, Raphael, has proved that listening to the voice of God really pays off.

Just a few years ago he had a distinct impression from God that he should start a new church in a tiny village. Today that tiny village is fast becoming an important city in Uganda. These are Raphael's own words:

One day about four years ago I was invited by a friend to preach a crusade in his hometown. We had a huge gathering of about 5,000 people, many of whom gave their lives to the Lord in our four days of preaching.

God moved tremendously. On the last day of the crusade, one friend of mine suggested that we relax a bit before traveling back to Kampala. "Why don't we travel to Karuma where the road crosses the Nile River?" he said. "There is so much to see."

We drove our mission truck to the bridge in Karuma. True to his word there was a lot of wildlife along the road. At the bridge particularly, where the road crosses the Nile, it was well endowed with primates especially baboons. The view of the White Nile waters rushing under the bridge was such a site.



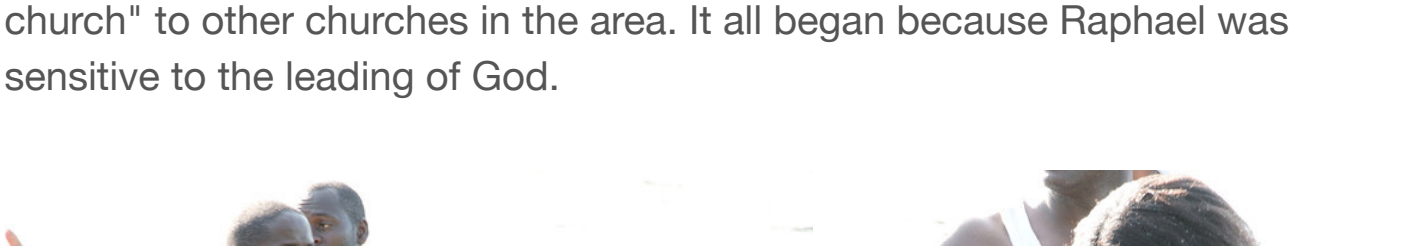
The Karuma Church

Just less than a mile from the bridge is the Karuma town. We hardly reached there when I heard the Lord speak to me, "You need to put a church in this place. There is none."

It was clear that something needed to be done urgently to salvage what had remained from a prolonged period of war.

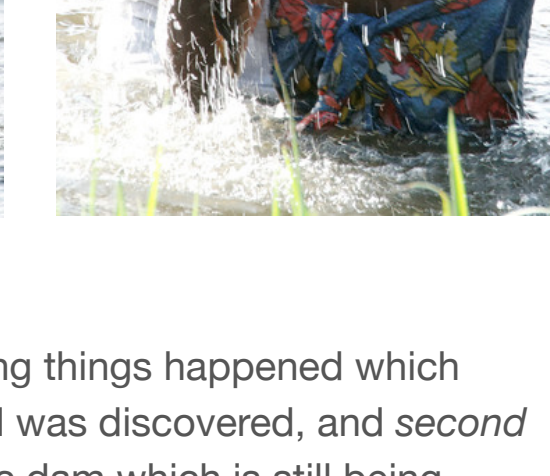
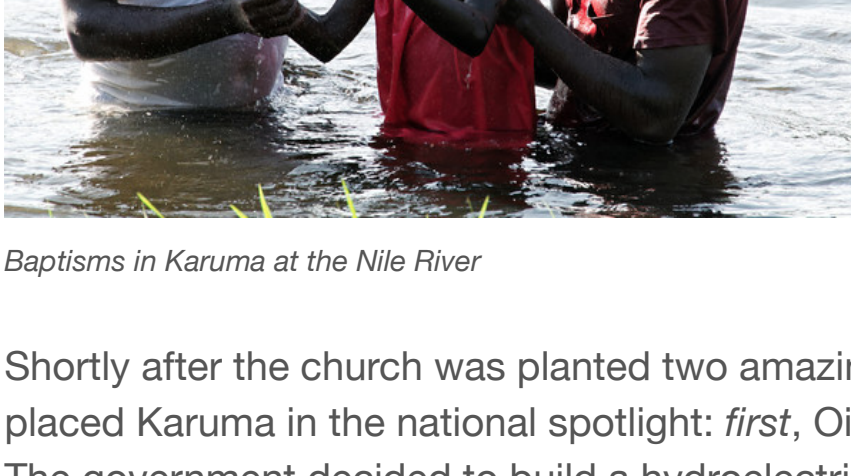
There were bars everywhere. Men and women as well as adolescent boys sat to drink from as early as 8 AM. I could feel the burden in the heart of God. All that most people knew was war and running from tyrants. A lot of men up to now spend time either playing cards or drinking. Most of the work was left to women fend for the family. Yet these are some of the most loving people one can find in the world.

At the end of our brief tour of the town I told the people that we were going to be back in two weeks to see where we can find some land to put the church.

Since that time the church at Karuma has grown strong. It is the "mother church" to other churches in the area. It all began because Raphael was sensitive to the leading of God.

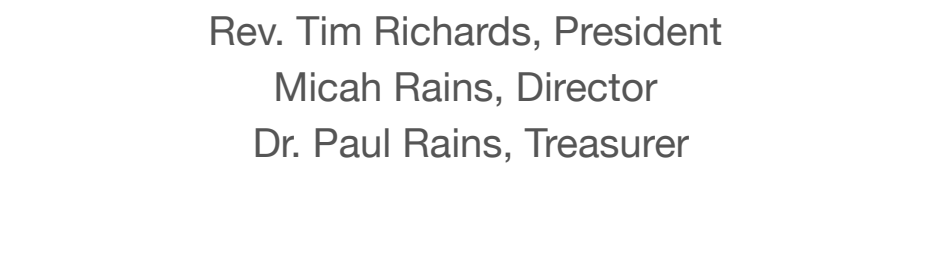
The average missionary from the US going overseas needs \$40,000 to \$100,000 per year. The average evangelist in a third world country needs \$1,200 to \$6,000 per year.
