Baptism in the River Nile



baptize people. I elected to be the photographer!




My mood of trepidation was soon overcome by





joy. The Spirit of God was present. As people emerged from the water after baptism there was a joyful and unmistakable sense that burdens were lifted and bonds were broken. There
